Last week, I shared how much the children were enjoying the depth of their learning in subjects such as Art and History and this has been so clear in the School Council Letters that I've been receiving from across the school. Reading these is such a joy, hearing form children about the value of our work and how much they care about the community, as well as their persuasive techniques which pupils have clearly been developing in their English Learning!

Many of these letters very much reflect our Christian Values of Love, Stewardship, Hope, Trust and Perseverance. From outlining ideas for developing our playground, supporting pupils who join our school family, many show a real social awareness and the importance of showing others we care. Some mention the challenges of the cost of living and the current world events and wanting to help our local and wider communities more. Some include quotes from poets and campaigners such as Maya Angelou. Many letters talk of

children's personal journeys and how they now feel confident and ready to have their voice heard. Letter from pupils in Y6 talk of them leaving a legacy for the next generation. The overriding comment in the letters is respect for others and how those applying are aware of the importance of listening to all, and valuing other's opinions.
