Dear Parents,

I hope you all enjoyed a great Easter Break and managed to enjoy the sunny weather we had. We are delighted to be now really moving forward with areas that have been a little 'on hold' over the last 2 years. This includes more trips and visits to enrich the curriculum, as well as having more opportunities for pupils to get involved in whole school development. You will also be aware that statutory assessments are back in certain year groups, such as Y6 SATs and the new Y4 Multiplication Table Check and we will be sure to help the children through these in the calm and sensible approach we've always taken. More information for those year groups will be in class newsletters, if not already.

Pupil Questionnaire

Empowering pupils to have a say about the school is key and each year pupils take part in a Pupil Questionnaire, which they now complete themselves, electronically, in school. This helps us to see the impact of keys areas we've been working on, such as developing our curriculum so that subjects really develop key skills in those areas e.g., learning history as a Historian (looking at and comparing artefacts, for example), not just learning about a time. We have already seen that the number of pupils who feel school provides enough music and sport opportunities has **increased by 10%** from last year- really reflecting the quality PE and Music learning, as well as extra curriculum sports clubs and music tuition which some have signed up to.

We have also seen a positive increase in the number of pupils saying that their teachers understand how they learn more. This reflects the hard work form all staff to really understand the exact impact of lockdowns and absence over the Covid Pandemic and support children with their individual needs, so to enable them to be more confident in their learning. I'm sure you'd join me in thanking staff for their hard work and support to all pupils in what has been a challenging few year for all with their learning.

The largest increase also links to how children feel supportive, this time by their classmates. There was an **11% increase in how supported by their classmates, pupils felt,** reflecting the care and kindness pupils feel towards one another, which reflects our Christian Values which we've been focusing on, of Love, Trust, Hope. This, along with the comments made by pupils shows that they have a very real understanding of our Vision 'Together, we take steps towards a brighter future' and understand how individual but worthy every child is. Many children talked in the 'free text' about how our Worship and reflection time to think about these values, really helps them to understand and care for not only themselves and their own feelings but those of others. I was humbled by how many told us the impact that tis has on them and their development.

We will as a leadership team, along with wider staff be reflecting upon the findings from the questionnaire and use this information with our future development, but we can't wait to share the full questionnaire with parents, as we are so proud of what children are telling us about our school. We're just finalising the format of the questionnaire and will be sharing this, with parents in the coming weeks.

This week has also seen the move forward with regards to the need for any formal Covid Measures, which we included in the letter before the Easter Break. Here is a reminder of this:

In this letter, I wanted to update parents with how we are moving to 'Living with Covid' as part of the national plans. We have met as a Trust Team, attended UKSHA webinar and read the Government information. This is now about seeing Covid as a Respiratory Illness, so when we return for the Summer Term, we will use these guides:

- Anyone with a high temperature, or who is not well enough to be in school, should stay at home until well.
- You do not need to test children and access to free tests has ended.
- If your child does have a positive test result (if you have LFTs still at home and chose to test), they need to stay at home for 3 days. They do not need to 'test to release' and if they are well and no longer have a high temperature, they can return.
- There is no longer a need for face coverings
- We will continue to exercise good hand hygiene, good respiratory hygiene (with coughs and sneezes and 'catch it, bin it, kill it approach' and ensure rooms are not stuffy, with good ventilation.
- We will no longer be having a staggered start to the day. Gates will open at 8.30 and parents will drop their children at the same gates they are using now, and we will continue to be out greeting the children. All gates will close at 8.45, ready for registration.
- To dismiss children at home time and ensure everyone is safely delivered to their grown-ups, we will have EYFS to Y2 dismissed at 2.50pm with Y3-6 dismissed at 3pm. Again, all children will use the same gates.

We know the impact that lockdowns and isolation has had and can see the real benefit of these new, national measures.
