As previously shared in the newsletter, the school has been working closely with the local police due to concerns related to the smell of cannabis coming from one of the houses backing onto the back lane. 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UNDERSTANDING YOUR CHILD'S WELLBEING AND EMOTIONS

A 4 WEEK WORKSHOP FOR PARENTS, GRANDPARENTS AND CARERS

At 1:00-2:55 on Wednesday on 5th, 12th, 19th and 26th.

A relaxed and informal workshop to support parents thinking about:

- what we mean by 'mental health'
- how we can recognise good mental health in children
- how to support children/ourselves when things are more difficult
- playful ways to engage with children

The facilitators will introduce topics each week with an informal discussion over tea/coffee and biscuits – alongside this, there will be the opportunity for parents to share ideas together about what they find helpful and unhelpful in supporting their children's emotional health, although there is no pressure to talk about personal experiences!
